

Introduction

Thank you for purchasing a walk-in cooler or freezer from NAKS, Inc, Inc. As a company, we are proud to say that all of our products are designed and manufactured to the needs and standards of our customers. This manual contains important information and instructions for installing, using, and servicing NAKS, Inc walk-ins. Althoughno single set of directions will apply to every situation, some basic instructions do apply. Please read all these documents carefully before installing or servicing your walk-in in order to make sure your walk-in is operating safely and efficiently. For a special installation please feel free to contact us.

A Packing List and Assembly Drawings are included with the shipment that identifies every item shipped with the corresponding panel numbers and indicates how it is assembled. Panels are stacked in the best way possible to minimize the risk of shipment damage. They are not stacked in order of panel numbers.


Wall Panels


All panels consist of 4 inches of thermal resistant insulated foam with a 24-gauge stucco embossed galvalume finish on the exterior. The panels have male and female grooves with gaskets, resulting in an air-tight seal. Panels are provided with male andfemale cam-locking device sets that are positioned to be aligned with each panel. There is a hole located in the interior metal panel that allows you to have access to the male lock.

Cam Locks

- Make sure all cam-lock locking arms are in theopen position.
- Push panels together and insert the hex wrench (provided) through the hole and firmly engage with hex opening.
- Turn wrench 1/4 clockwise, this will engage the locking arm over the locking pin.
- Continue to turn wrench for 1/2 turn or until panels are fastened together tightly.
- Do not over tighten cam locks as this can causethe cam to separate from the panel.
- Plugs have been provided to cover the holes for the wrench.










Receiving Shipment

- Check the shipment carefully.
- Account for all items listed and inspect each container for damage.
- If concealed damage is discovered, immediately report issues to both the trucking company and NAKS,
 Inc, Inc. to file a claim.
- When handling panels keep them flat to prevent denting and avoid resting them on their corner edges.
- Always have another person help while handing the panels.

Site Preparation

- Chalk the perimeter outline of the structure to ensure that there is proper space for your unit.
- If the Walk-in is adjacent to a building wall, allow a minimum of 2-inch clearance. Also allow a minimum 2-inch clearance for ceiling height. Refer to refrigeration equipment space requirements for additional clearance.
- Measure from corner to corner to make sure it is square.
- The entire floor area must be leveled from this highest point. Floor leveling can be done with wooden shims.

CAUTION: Please be sure the area is free of debris and swept clean. The floor






Floor Installation (if applicable)

Depending on your walk-in unit, it may be supplied with or without floor panels. If your unit is floorless, proceed to the Vinyl Track Installation Section.

- Using your assembly drawings of your walk-in, lay out all of the floor panels in the correct order. Be sure the panel is level in length and width.
- After making sure the edges are flush, tighten the locks together, making sure the panels are evenly aligned and secured together.
- Follow this procedure until the last panel is in place. The last panel will be near the door. Refer to assembly drawings provided.
- As you assemble your floor, check to make sure that existing floor is leveled, and the chalk line is followed.



IMPORTANT: To ensure proper installation, the floor must be perfectly leveled. If not, the panels will not seal properly.









Vinyl Track Installation (if applicable)

Floorless walk-in units are provided with a vinyl track that runs under the panels for stability in your unit.

- Using the outline chalk line perimeter, create an additional perimeter to mark the interior outline, 41/2inches from the exterior outline.
- Make sure the diagonals are the same measurement.
- Lay two lines of silicone caulk within the 4-inch vinyltrack location. Put one line of caulk on each inside edge of the track. (Top along the panel and bottomalong the floor.)
- Lay out all of the vinyl track in the correct placement. Make sure the corners meet at 450angle.
- As you assemble your floor, check to make sure that the chalk line is followed.




Wall Installation

Before placing the wall panels, make sure all of the cams are in the open position. Using your assembly drawings, lay out all of the panels in the correct order. Start by placing the # 1 panel, then add the adjacent panel to it. Lock them together. As all the panel are assembled on a track or floor, tighten the cam locks with one another and make sure the panels are flush on the top and sides. Do not force a cam to lock. If it does not lock, check to see if the panels are firmly together. Do not lock the panels to the floor until all wall and ceiling panels are locked together. Make sure the holes for the cam locks are facing inside of the unit. If you notice that the floor is uneven, adjustments must be made to ensure wall panels are flush at the top.

Door & Ceiling Installation


The door panel should be placed like any other wall panel. The last wall panel installed should be a panel adjacent to the door. Follow the assembly


drawings to see which panel is the last to be placed.

Once you have the wall panels and door panel installed, locate the roof panel that is located at the end of the unit. Make the roof flush with the sides of the wall panels. Place the second panel on top and align the panel with the sides. Lock thetwo roof panels into place. As the roof panels are being placed, lightly lock the roof panels to the wallpanels.

After the roof panels are in place, lock them tightly to the wall panels. Then lock the wall panels to the floor panels, if applicable.

After all of the roof and wall panels are secured in place, check that all of the cam locks are locked in tightly. The door and frame should be flush around the perimeter. Clean panels of any dirt, metal shavings or other debris by using a non-abrasive drycloth.










Hinge Door Adjustment Instructions

- Remove access cover by depressing point "A" and pulling it outward.
- Loosen 4 mounting screws on each strap, but do not remove screw.
- 3. Open door to break seal with magnetic gasket.
- 4. Adjust tip of door up by turning top hinge adjustment screw clockwise (opposite for Left Hand Door) and the bottom hinge adjustment screw counter- clockwise (opposite for Left Hand Door) so door spacing is even.
- 5. Tighten 4 mounting screws on each hinge.
- 6. Replace cover by inserting point "A" first.

Door Handle

- Easy to operate, notch slides to lock
- Door easily pulls or pushes open when it's unlocked
- Locking mechanism is located on the outside of the unit to resist freeze-up
- Located on the inside of the unit, there is a glow-in-the-dark release knob to prevent lock-ins.






Electrical Installations

- Refer to wiring diagram below for installation all 115V power.
- For refrigeration equipment, refer to electrical instructions associated with the equipment. Provide separate circuits from the refrigeration and electrical shown below.
- A wiring shall be copper conductors only suitable for at least 750C/1670F.

A three-wire, three-phase, 220-240 V permanently connected appliance intended for connection to branch circuit conductors operating at 150V or less to ground shall be marked where visible during installation with the following or equivalent: "Do not connect to a circuit operating at more than 150V to ground." The marking shall identify the leads or terminals that are to be supplied by circuit conductors of 150V or less to ground.

CAUTION: Risk of electric shock.

CAUTION: This section should be done by a qualified electrician.

Plumbing

Condensate piping from the evaporator shall be routed outside the walk-in cooler/freezer and continued to an approved floor drain/floor sink. Piping to be sized and routed in accordance with local building codes and shall maintain required slope and insulation to prevent freezing where applicable. Drill completely through the panel wallto route condensate outside the walk-in. Protect the piping at this location with a bushing and completely seal the penetration airtight. (Failure to seal the penetration airtight can result in condensation forming along the penetration on the interior and exterior of the cooler.)

All penetrations through the walk-in wall must be sealed airtight.

Maintenance

It is important for proper upkeep of the walk-in unit to ensure many years of service. Having the walk-in floors wet canbe slippery and hazardous.

The following tasks should be performed:

- All surfaces, magnetic door gasket and door gasket should be cleaned frequently with warm water and milddetergents and rinse thoroughly with hot water. Avoid using excessive water.
- Keep all walkway surfaces clean and free of spilled liquids and food particles.
- Lubricate door hinge pivots, latches and inside releases at least once a year.
- Check all hardware and fasteners regularly to be sure that they are firmly anchored.
- Inspect refrigeration equipment frequently for proper functioning of evaporators, drain pan heaters, defrost controls and drains line heaters.

Troubleshooting

Frost or Condensation around door

This may indicate that there is a poor gasket seal or a defective heat cable. Check the door alignment and see if the hinges are adjusted properly. Check for a constant power source to the heat cable

Cam lock not engaging

Make sure wall panels are flush on sides and top, so cams are lined up properly. Reset cam by turning it counterclockwise until it resets. Then relockcam.

Cam wrench is binding in cam hole

Only insert the wrench far enough to catch the mechanism. Make sure you are inserting the taperedend of the wrench in the hole.

Ceiling panels won't lock into walls

If walls have been locked to floor, unlock walls from the floor, lock ceiling panels down to walls and relock wallsto floor.

Ceiling overhangs walls

If walls are racked at the top, loosen wall cams and adjust walls so the tops of the walls line up. If walls are level at the top, loosen corner wall panel and bump outwall panel to line up with outer edge of ceiling. Lock ceiling to wall and re-lock corner seam.

The Order is the entire contract between you, the buyer, and North American Kitchen Solutions, the seller, for products purchased from North American Kitchen Solutions. These Terms apply to the Order unless expressly modified or waived in writing by an officer of North American Kitchen Solutions. An Order may only be cancelled by you upon payment of reasonable cancellation charges for expenses incurred or commitments made by North American Kitchen Solutions. Captions in these Terms are for convenience only.
- 2. <u>Pricing.</u> The price for North American Kitchen Solutions' goods, material, equipment, or items ("*Products*") is complete, and no deductions, credits, or offsets may be made without North American Kitchen Solutions' express written consent. Prices are subject to change and surcharges in the event of cost increases in materials and transportation. All complete component accessory material manufactured by others and furnished with Products such as motors, drives, vibration equipment, controls, or other completely assembled component structures, are subject to adjustment to the price at time of shipment regardless of the date of original order entry.
- 3. <u>Sales and Similar Taxes</u>. North American Kitchen Solutions' prices do not include sales, use, excise, or similar taxes. Present or future sales, use, excise, or other similar tax applicable to the sale of Products shall be paid you, unless an acceptable tax exemption certificate is provided to North American Kitchen Solutions.
- 4. **Payment.** North American Kitchen Solutions reserves the right to require full or partial payment in advance of any order. Pro-rata payments are due as shipments are made. - 5. Return Policy ALL SALES ARE FINAL. Because we custom manufacture our hoods to each customer's specifications, ALL SALES ARE FINAL. We may accept the return of non-custom goods at our discretion, but a restocking fee of 30% will apply and all shipping costs are the responsibility of the purchaser or end user. No merchandise may be returned without a Return Goods Authorization (RGA). Items returned for warranty replacement or exchange will not be eligible for credit if not received within 14 days of the issuance of a Return Goods Authorization.
- 6. <u>Free Shipping.</u> Free shipping offers are limited to standard shipping to the 48 contiguous United States.
- 7. <u>Delivery</u> Shipping and delivery dates are estimates only. No delay in delivery will subject North American Kitchen Solutions to any costs, damages or fees for late delivery. Delivery of Products is made F.O.B. point of shipment, unless otherwise stated. North American Kitchen Solutions shall not be liable for delay due to causes beyond its reasonable control (i.e., force majeure events). In the event of such a delay, the date of delivery shall be extended for a period equal to the time lost by reason of the delay.
